

Chairman's Update

Despite the day being somewhat wet and miserable, around 18 people turned up for the litter pick in October where over 20 black bin bags were filled and left for East Suffolk District Council (ESDC) to collect.

Sadly, ESDC no longer give the parish council £25 for undertaking this task, nor do they provide gloves or hi-viz jackets. In addition, delivery and collection by them is no longer offered. As a result the parish council has purchased the equipment necessary for us to do future litter picks in the village, as Priory Court has already done.

The path in Paupers Wood has had some attention, with branches being used to clearly mark the semi-circular path and along part of the way, wood chippings have been used to make the walk easier.

Having largely completed the last parish council action plan, a new 5 year action plan is being prepared. Any suggestion from parishioners would be welcome <u>please email the clerk.</u> We are aiming to publish the completed plan following January's meeting.

Over the next few weeks, the aim is to complete work in Victoria Field, which will include tidying the growing hedge and repairing the fence, again.

Three members of the parish council have painted the railings under the railway bridge white, as they were in a poor state. They now can be seen clearly.

At the end of the month the Christmas Tree outside the village hall will go up, together with the lights.

On November 11th, the usual act of Remembrance took place at the parish war memorial, with poppy wreaths being laid on the memorial. As is fitting, both village schools were represented on this very solemn occasion.

It might interest readers to know that the date on the war memorial is incorrect. It was not unveiled in September 1919, but October 1920. It would be interesting to know why this happened.
