### The Reverend Canon Ian Wilson

#### Services

We have had three very successful services at St. Martin's Church since our churches have been allowed to open for public worship. There has been an average attendance of 22 and, in August, we will continue to hold one service each Sunday in the benefice and these will be at Kirton, Bucklesham and Nacton.

The services are as follows:

- 10.30am Sunday 2nd August Kirton Holy Communion (35 places available).
- 10.30am Sunday 9th August Bucklesham Morning Worship (30 places available).
- 10.30am Sunday 16th August Nacton Morning Worship (35 places available).
- 10.30am Sunday 23rd August Kirton Morning Worship (35 places available).
- 10.30am Sunday 30th August Bucklesham Holy Communion (30 places available).

Due to the COVID restrictions, places at the services are limited and details of how to book a place at the services will be circulated in the usual way at the beginning of the week leading up to the Sunday in question.

In addition to limiting numbers at our services, it is also strongly advised that face masks are worn in church (with the usual exemptions).

It is also my hope that by September, all eight of our parishes will have an act of public worship in their churches and details of these services will published in the next edition of this magazine. However, for various reasons, it is very unlikely that we will ever be able to return to the number of services we had across the benefice before the lockdown.

### Worship

One of the successes of the lockdown period, is that many people have really appreciated receiving our worship resources, including sermons, both written and recorded, (they are also available via our Facebook page and have also been used by people outside our diocese), and because they have been so well received, even after our churches are beginning to open, we will continue to provide all of these resources.

It has also been very interesting to hear how people have felt they have been connected with the whole of our worshipping community by using our resources

and, in particular, they have felt that, 'wherever we are, we are all united in having the same service'. However, as we move towards having Holy Communion, some may fear that they will lose out on this sense of 'common worship'. Of course, I entirely understand this fear and to maintain the sense of common worship for those who are unable to attend church, I have put together a service that can be used at home and as part of the Holy Communion service so that we continue to be united. We will be using this for the first time on 2nd August.

#### **Finances**

Along with all other charitable organisations, the lockdown has put considerable pressure on our church finances. In January, we were asked to pay £75,000 as our 'quota' to the diocese and this was divided between our eight churches to pay over the year. This pays towards the stipend (pay) of the clergy, the cost of the central organisation of the church and the on-going costs of the national church. Of course, whilst our churches were closed for public worship during the lockdown, the work of the clergy did not stop but a large part of our income did. As a result, we will have a considerable shortfall in our ability to pay the quota and each parish will be asking those who had been giving regularly to the church to continue to do this. They will also be asking for help from those who may not have been paying regularly. The church nationally is now in a very difficult position financially and may, like many other charities, be looking at ways of reducing the financial burden it carries; this could mean considering making some clergy redundant. This is an absolute last resort and in order to avoid this we need to look at how we are going to be able to pay our way and we need the help of many people as possible.

### **Covid-19: Church of England guidance**

The Government has issued a statement that face coverings will be mandatory in Places of Worship from 8<sup>th</sup> August. We will study detailed government regulations and guidance once they are available and will update our guidance accordingly. In the meantime, we continue to strongly advise that face coverings should be worn by all those attending a place of worship, including ministers, worshippers, staff, volunteers, contractors and visitors, where there may be other people present; remembering that they are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from coronavirus (COVID-19) and that they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing.

### **World Mission Conference**

10 October 2020 10.00am

At this year's conference – now taking place on Zoom - we will be discussing how Christians can engage in world issues at all levels.

The theme of the conference will be 'Christianity in the Public Space' and our keynote speaker will be Professor Andrew Bradstock.

Andrew has been researching, teaching and writing about the relationship between Christian faith, politics and social engagement for more than 30 years. An academic and practitioner, his experience includes establishing New Zealand's first Centre for Theology and Public Issues (at the University of Otago), co-directing the Centre for Faith and Society at the Von Hügel Institute, Cambridge, and Secretary for Church and Society with the United Reformed Church. He is author of *Louder than Words: action for the 21st-century church* (DLT, 2007) and the authorised biography of Bishop David Sheppard, *Batting for the Poor* (SPCK, 2019). He is an emeritus professor of the University of Winchester.

We will also be joined by Luke Harman from Christian Aid who will talk about a successful campaign using a range of activities to raise awareness of an issue in the public space. There will be opportunities to ask questions of both speakers and to discuss in groups.

# Confirmation of Bishop Stephen Cottrell as the new Archbishop of York

Bishop Stephen Geoffrey Cottrell was confirmed as the 98th Archbishop of York. The service was broadcast on the Church of England Facebook page. Commenting on the service, Bishop Stephen Cottrell said, "Following in the footsteps of my many predecessors, I look forward to serving our nation and bringing the love and peace of Christ to our world, especially here in the North." A further service from York Minster was broadcast at 9.00am last Sunday morning with the theme 'Prayer and Encouragement'.

### **Bishop Martin**

"You may have seen +Stephen Cottrell as he took up the role of Archbishop of York hammering with his crozier on the doors of York Minster from the *inside!* It was a powerful symbol of what so many of us have been experiencing as the outward turn of the church into the world, and the appeal that we do not retreat back inside those doors. I am so grateful, and in awe of the work, many of you and your congregations have been engaged with, reaching out, engaging, serving our communities".
