Chairman's Update

Recently it has been announced that the Sizewell C Freight Distribution Park is no longer going to be located just off the Old Felixstowe Road but at the Logistics Park off the A14, where there are already two large warehouses. It means that the 500+ lorries a day driving past the crematorium and using the T junction onto the Old Felixstowe Road will not happen. The development opposite the crematorium for light industry is still possible although there has been no update recently.

Next month the aim is to tidy the new hedge around Victoria Field and to replace damaged plants. Whilst some parts of the hedge are growing well, other sections have been damaged by animals and humans walking through and crushing the saplings.

As there are no longer buses going through Nacton, the parish council is looking into reversing the seating at the bus shelter. This would then give some protection from the weather whilst being able to keep an eye on children in Victoria Field or just to enjoy the view.

Several silver birch trees in Paupers Wood have died over the last few months. These are being cut down as they are not safe. The parish council is looking into planting some new trees in the areas cleared. The half circle path in the wood is also being cleared of bramble and nettles. The cut down trees will be used to further mark the route of the path. Finally yew trees have been planted to help mark the boundary of the council land in the wood.

Information Board



Recently an information board has been placed in Victoria Field. This tells something of the background to Paupers' Wood and also how Victoria Field came to be given to the parish.

Telephone Box



It has been brought to our attention that the red telephone box in the village still has a dialling tone and therefore can be used for 999 calls in an emergency.

Changes to telephone lines

At a recent meeting, Nacton Parish Council identified some concerns that the impending discontinuation of copper telephone landlines to residential properties might cause some challenges.

The old system will be switched off in 2025 and landlines will use broadband to make calls. If you rely on a landline, you will still be able to make calls but the technology that powers them will be different.

The landline will use the internet to make calls, rather than the copper network. For most residents who have an existing broadband connection the change will be straightforward. For those without a broadband connection at home, your supplier will install one.

However, if there's a power cut, digital phones will not work unless it has a battery back-up and you will need to use a mobile for phone calls. For some residents this might be a problem if the mobile reception in your home is poor or non-existent. So called 'not spots'.


For those residents living in a part of the parish which is a 'not spot' there is a further consequence. If you have smart meters fitted for gas and electricity, the meters will not work without a mobile signal.

As a result, the Parish Council intends to lobby the mobile providers to improve coverage in areas of the parish with signal problems. In order for us to have a clear picture of those areas where there are connection issues, we need your help and kindly request that you <u>complete our survey</u> (It will only take a couple of minutes).
